- A. Britain changed the system of measurement in 1970s. But in the shops people still use the old measures. Customers may ask for their fruit in pounds and ounces rather than kilos and grams. They may ask milk in pints and quarters rather than litres, petrol in gallons rather than in litres.
- B. The majority of independent schools, including public schools, are single – sex, although in recent years girls have been allowed to join the sixth forms of boy's schools. Independent schools also include religious schools (Jewish, Catholic, Muslim etc.) and schools for ethnic minorities. In England there are 47 universities, including the Open University which teaches with TV and radio, about 400 colleges and institutes of higher education. The oldest universities in England are Oxford and Cambridge.
- C. In the Royal Arms three lions symbolize England, a lion rampant – Scotland, and a harp – Ireland. The whole is encircled and is supported by a lion and a unicorn. The lion has been used as a symbol of national strength and the British monarchy for many centuries. The unicorn, a mythical animal that looks like a horse with along straight horn, has appeared on the Scottish and British royal coats of arms for many centuries, and it is a symbol of purity.
- D. Liverpool, 'the city of ships', is England's second greatest port, ranking after London. The most interesting sight in Liverpool is the docks. Cambridge and Oxford Universities are famous centres of learning. Stonehenge is a prehistoric monument, presumably built by Druids, members of an order of priests in ancient Britain. Tintagel Castle is King Arthur's reputed birthplace. Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of Archbishop of Canterbury, head of the Church of England. The British Museum is the largest and richest museum in the world. It was founded in 1753 and contains one of the world's richest collections of antiquities.

E. In recent years foreign food have become a regular part of the British diet. Indian and Chinese dishes are particularly popular for evening meals. The British are famous for their love of sweet things and afternoon tea with sandwiches; scones, jam and several kinds of cake, was once a traditional custom. Most working people don't have tea as an afternoon 'meal', but they do have a sort break in the middle of the afternoon for a cup of tea. Tea is often also drink with lunch and dinner.
